The contractor was immediately notified, swept up the dried residue and disposed of properly.

City utility staff collected a water sample and confirmed the presence of chlorine, indicating the discharge was City water. It was identified via camera truck there are 3 lateral connections attaching to the HDPE from Fabritek's lot. The line located approximately 166' up from the outfall was actively discharging at the time of camera inspection with no visible trace of discharge further upline. We spoke to Robert Hahn with Fabritek regarding the issue and he agreed to have his maintenance team check their equipment for leaks. 10/6 UPDATE - I spoke to Mr. Hahn regarding any issues found during their own inspection. He stated they found a leak in their spray jets, but have contracted with a plumbing company to perform the repair and eliminate the cross connection to private storm.

There were some fluids from one of the vehicles which may have entered the storm drain in a small quantity. It was hard to assess due to weeds in the street and storm drain. We applied absorbent to prevent any further contamination.

There was fluid spill from the vehicles that may have gotten into a storm drain on the southwest corner of the intersection in front of the McDonalds. Absorbent was applied to contain fluids.

There was a small amount of vehicle fluid which entered the City's storm sewer. The Police Department applied Sta-Dri to the affected areas and placed booms in front of the inlets to prevent any additional discharge to the storm sewer system.
IDR24-006	3/23/2024	9:45 PM	Timothy Vaught	540-662-2298	Meadow Branch Ave Winchester VA 22601	Fire and rescue responded to a spill of an unknown substance on the roadway on Meadow Branch Ave today at 11:38 a.m. We identified a trail of what is suspected to be a hydrocarbon-based material on the roadway spanning from Northwestern Pike and Round Hill Rd into the city, onto Meadow Branch westbound, and into a parking lot at 31 W. Jubal Early Dr. We secured traffic to an affected lane of Jubal Early due to several vehicles experiencing loss of control. There appeared to be three storm drains that were affected- the one on the south side of Jubal Early Dr which empties into Abrams Creek under the pedestrian bridge of the Green Trail, and two on Loudoun Street in the area of the ABC store. Fire and Rescue deployed Sta-Dri in front of potentially affected inlets. Further investigation was completed on 3/25/24, inlets along Meadow Branch Ave were checked and it appears that minimal fluid, if any, entered the City's storm sewer system.

The crew on-site was advised of the City's MS4 program and were told to either cease operations or place appropriate inlet protection downstream of their work area. The crew decided to stop work. There were no chemicals in use, it was strictly sediment laden water.
IDR24-008	4/13/2024	10:00 PM	Samuel Bohus	540-325-1342	1333 Berryville Ave Winchester VA 22601	On April 13, 2024, we responded to a gas leak from a vehicle. Incident was at 1333 Berryville Ave. Arrived on scene and had about 15 gallons of gasoline leaking from a punctured tank on a van. Driver reported that she was traveling South on I81 and swerved to miss debris in the road. As she entered the left lane, she struck metal debris puncturing the fuel tank. She got off the interstate and stopped at the above address. The attendant working feared the van was going to catch fire and he sprayed it down with water. This caused the fuel to run through the parking lot down the gutter and almost into a storm water collection site. We arrived and were able to stop the flow about 1 foot from the drain. We do not believe any fuel entered the storm water drain. Information was gathered and can be located in our report. We wanted to make you aware so you could follow up and ensure the property owner was able to get the area cleaned.
